Additionally, how can carbon pricing (such as a carbon tax) complement these existing policies? 2- What are the potential implications, both advantages and disadvantages, of introducing a carbon pricing mechanism like a carbon tax, particularly in terms of employment, economic growth, and revenue generation, for Government of Maharashtra? 3- How carbon pricing instruments encourage corporates to set internal carbon pricing into their businesses and improve profitability? 4- How can government budgets effectively integrate and prioritise climate-friendly initiatives, such as renewable energy, to mitigate greenhouse gas emissions, and what are the best practices in climate budget tagging observed in various state governments, particularly in Maharashtra? Panel Discussion 12:25 – 13:55	 What legal and institutional changes are required to introduce a Carbon Pricing mechanism, such as a Carbon Tax, in Maharashtra? Additionally, can the GST regime provide opportunities for introducing a Carbon Tax? What regulatory changes are needed at both the national and state levels to facilitate this? Also, is it possible for State governments to levy a Carbon Tax on certain taxes that remain outside the ambit of the GST? In the realm of institutional and governance frameworks, how have eco-taxes and green taxes impacted the journey towards green transition in local contexts? Specifically, how have these mechanisms influenced the state's progress, and can we consider a similar tax mechanism based on carbon equivalence in Maharashtra to further encourage this transition? How can at sub-national level (in this case state of Maharashtra) effectively implement an inclusive Carbon Policy mechanism like Carbon Tax, drawing from local eco-taxes as well as global best practices in compensating affected groups, and what specific policies can be adopted to utilize the revenue for minimising its impact on low-income households and key economic sectors?
